PREFACE



The present edition of the "Songs of Kappa Kappa Gamma" is the sixth to be published by the fraternity.

Early in 1886, Beta Beta Chapter compiled the first Song Book to be published. Three years later in 1889, Chi Chapter edited and published "Songs of Kappa" The third edition which made its appearance in 1897 was edited by Beta Epsilon Chapter and published by the Grand Council. The fourth edition, published in 1916, was compiled by Jeannette Comstock and Juliette Hollenback of Beta Sigma Chapter. The fifth edition was edited and published under the supervision of Carolyn L. McGowan of Beta Rho Chapter. The sixth and present edition is edited and published under the direction of Winifred Glass of Gamma Theta Chapter.

No small part of the difficulty attending the publication of the Song Book has been caused by the necessity for scrupulous care with regard to the use of copyrighted music. The effort to find the owners of the copyright in every case and to arrange for use of music has been made most conscientiously. If any omission in this regard has occurred, the committee beg at this time to express their sincere regret for the unintentional error.

Every effort has been made to secure the use of music for all the songs published. In some cases, however, this has proved impossible because of the rigid rules applying on all copyrighted music. In such cases, the words have been published only of songs which are certain to be familiar to all.
